**MPH-900® Alarm Leads To Heroin Bust**

Most recently in Springfield, MA an officer was made aware of a stolen or unregistered vehicle by the ELSAG system. Little did the officer know that the stop would lead to a huge heroin bust. The officers seized in excess of 100 individual bags of heroin that the operator intended to distribute. This is a solid example of how the MPH-900® keeps America's streets and citizens safe.

**JULY 9 / 5:55 p.m.** – Police arrested Wayne Everett, 62, of Yorktown, for misdemeanors of aggravated unlicensed operation and suspended registration, and the traffic infractions of unregistered and uninsured vehicle. Officer Michael Madaus was patrolling Rt. 202 in a vehicle equipped with the MPH-900® ALPR technology, when the system “hit” on plate numbers that were allegedly suspended. Officer Madaus conducted a traffic stop and identified the driver as Everett. A DMV check showed the license plates were suspended for insurance lapse and Everett’s driver’s license had allegedly expired. In addition, Everett could not provide proof of insurance and the vehicle was not registered. After processing, the man was released on \$100 cash bail and is due in court on August 10.

**JULY 10 / 5:13 p.m.** – Police arrested Timothy J. Lynch, 27, of Scarsdale, on the misdemeanor charge of aggravated unlicensed operation and traffic violations of uninsured vehicle, having only one break lamp and possessing two valid drivers licenses. Officer Madaus was on patrol on Rt. 202 in a vehicle equipped with the ELSAG license plate reader, when the system “hit” on license plates that were allegedly suspended. In a traffic stop Officer Madaus identified the driver as Lynch. A DMV check showed the license plates were suspended for insurance lapse. Additionally, Lynch could not provide proof of insurance, and the car displayed only one lamp. Lynch was arrested and taken to YPD for processing. He was released on \$200 cash bail, he is due in court on August 10.

**JULY 14 / 9:19 a.m.** – Officer Michael Madaus was on patrol on Saw Mill River Road in a vehicle equipped with an ELSAG license plate reader when the system “hit” on license plates that were listed in the database as suspended. Officer Madaus conducted a traffic stop of the car whose plates had been flagged, and identified the driver as John Bernardo, 49, of Yorktown. A DMV check showed the car’s license plates were suspended due to lapsed insurance. Asked, Bernardo could not provide proof of insurance. The car did not have a rear bumper. Bernardo was charged with driving with a suspended registration, a misdemeanor, and two traffic infractions for the uninsured, bumper-less vehicle. Released on \$100 cash bail, he is due in court August 17.
